


# Forming the Documents on the European Talent Support Network

# Talent Centre qualification

In 2015 and in 2016 and 2017: 3 rounds of applications to become a European Talent Centre

Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Czechia, Denmark, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Switzerland and Turkey

India and Peru, United Arab Emirates
24 centres from 21 countries

Over 350 Talent Points from 42 countries

# Membership of the ETSN

is open and limited to organizations/joint organizations or parts of organizations active in the field of high ability.

- may have two forms:
  - that of a Talent Centre or of a Talent Point.
  - Talent Centres or Points situated in Europe are called European Talent Centres or European
     Talent Points
  - Talent Centres or Talent Points situated outside of Europe are called Associated European Talent Centres or Associated European Talent Points.



## **Talent Centres**

organise activities in the field of high ability

- in a region
- or a whole country

Talent Centres are qualified by the Qualification Committee of ECHA



### **Talent Points**

- organisations focusing on talent support (e.g. educational institutions), and/or of highly able young people, and/or their parents, teachers, mentors, policy makers, etc.
- Talent Points are registered by Talent Centres /Network Council.
- Guidelines for selection criteria of Talent Points are compiled by the Network Council and are finalized and accepted by the representatives of Talent Centres.



# The ETSN today - 2018

#### Colourful variety:

- field of gifted education,

- programs for talented people
- some of the European Talent Centres are associated with universities or state institutions;
- some others are fully non-governmental, non-profit enterprises.

### Aims of the ETSN

- to increase the identification and different types of support
- to boost research activity in the field of high ability and help transfer findings to practice, especially into education;
- to extend the current sharing of best practices (from policies to educational know-hows) in the field of high ability;
- to help the increase of the European Council for High Ability (ECHA) membership



### Aims of the ETSN

- to demonstrate that people involved in the field of high ability have reached a "critical mass" at the European (and worldwide) level;
- which needs to be taken into account when discussing EU and national policies in Europe (such as in education, research, innovation, social affairs, public health, etc.) related to high ability. (human and financial resources)
